While we have thoroughly enjoyed banner performances the past two years from our Canadian friends, The Guess Who and Loverboy, Venetian figured it was now time for "An American Band." That's right -- Grand Funk Railroad, natives of the Flint area, will "help us party it down" in East Park on Venetian Wednesday, July 25th.



Rolling Stone Magazine has said that "you cannot talk about rock in the 1970's without talking about Grand Funk Railroad." GFR has since recast itself as one of the ongoing dynamos of classic rock, featuring two members of the original trio, Don Brewer on drums and bassist Mel Schacher (the "God of Thunder"). Don is the writer/vocalist of various GFR hits, including the #1 hit, "We're An American Band", and has toured as the drummer with Bob Seger and The Silver Bullet Band.

Don and Mel have expanded the arena rock group with the highest octane pedigree in the rock 'n roll universe. GFR will also treat Venetian with the performance of lead guitarist Bruce Kulick - formerly of KISS, lead vocalist Max Carl - formerly of 38 Special and keyboardist Tim Cashion (Dr. Tim) - formerly with Robert Palmer and also Bob Seger and The Silver Bullet Band.

From yacht rockers to retro-classic rock gurus, Venetian will brace itself for a powerhouse concert which promises to be "some kind of wonderful" as the Grand Funk Railroad locomotive steams into Charlevoix's East Park station on Venetian Wednesday, July 25th.



## UNION GUNS EMERSON DRIVE Thursday, July 26 • East Park

Union Guns will serve up its country fried mix to the Venetian crowd, as true-blue country roots are seasoned with a pop edge and a well rounded mix of blue collar attitude. Union Guns promises to end their set with in-your-face country, setting the

stage for our country headliners on Venetian Thursday.

Time sure flies by when you're having a good time. It seems like only yesterday when our Venetian Thursday headliner, Emerson Drive, first graced the Venetian stage back in 2008. Yes, it was ten years ago when Venetian concerts returned to the then newly constructed Odmark Pavilion and Emerson Drive set the bar for Venetian country shows in a memorable performance.

Emerson Drive, which took on the namesake of the Emerson Trail which crosses their home turf in Western Alberta, Canada, was the first Canadian country group to reach #1 on the American Billboard charts with their

single "Moments". This hauntingly beautiful ballad boldly takes on delicate issues of loneliness, despair and hope. Emerson Drive also has scored awards from Billboard Magazine and the Academy of Country Music.

Don't think for a moment, however, that these "boys" won't be up for a party, as they're again rarin' and ready to reach out to Venetian with their toe-tappin', foot stompin', hip country trademark. From ballads which will tug at your heartstrings to rockin' countrified numbers, Emerson Drive will be layin' down a spirited concert on Venetian Thursday, July 26th.

Parades of Venelian

Everyone loves a parade and the Venetian Festival The parade travels down Bridge Street from Carhas twice the fun. On Saturday, July 28, Venetian offers one parade "by land" and one "by sea".

The annual Venetian Festival Street Parade kicks off at 11 a.m. complete with everything you'd expect in a summertime parade. This year's theme is "Venetian Carnivale".

Parade entries typically number about 75 and include everything from marching bands, clowns, floats, antique cars, horses and royalty from area festivals - including the newly crowned Miss Charlevoix and her court.



The carnival and midway, which opens on Wednesday, July 25, includes popular rides such as bumper cars, Tilt-a-Whirl and the Gravitron, as well as more more docile rides for the younger ones.

Returning to the Venetian Festival, the popular Traverse City-based Arnold Amusements Company will again be providing the rides, games and goodies.

The rides, midway and amusements will return to their usual position on downtown Mason Street and in the neighboring city parking lots to the north.

Rides, games, and treats will be available from 5 p.m.-11 p.m. on Wednesday, July 25; 12 p.m.-11 p.m. on Thursday, July 26; 1-11 p.m. on Friday, July 27 and 11 a.m.-11 p.m. on Saturday, July 28.

On Wednesday, all rides are \$10 for 10 (must buy sheet of 10 tickets). Thursday and Friday, tickets are \$1.25 each or 18 for \$20.

penter to the Clinton Street traffic light. After the parade, musical festivities will continue on Bridge Street and in both East and Bridge Parks.

Later that evening, as the musical performances come to an end, spectators can turn their eyes to Round Lake for the 88th annual Boat Parade. The event attracts throngs of spectators every year as boats of all shapes and sizes, adorned with lights, music, and animation parade around Round Lake starting shortly after 10 p.m.

Boats will be judged in several categories including a People's Choice Award for the best dockside decorated boat.

After the boat parade, the evening and the Festival will end brilliantly as low aerial/high intensity fireworks rock the sky above Round Lake Harbor, in a pyrotechnic extravaganza which has been recognized by USA Today as one of the premier displays in North America.

# Venelian Sealing Policy



When blankets outnumber the residents, things can get a little crazy down in East Park. As a result, Venetian has developed a seating policy to allow those in the Pavilion area to experience the Venetian concerts at all seating levels.

Tuesday through Friday, blankets and chairs can be placed in the park only after 12-noon. Blankets must be placed in front of the orange line in the bowl area in front of the stage and on the tiers. Chairs more than a 8" off the ground are not allowed in the blanket zone and will be placed aside by Festival and security staff. On Saturday chairs can be placed in the park only after 8:00 a.m. with adherence to the "Blanket Zone" lines.

In previous years, Venetian has allowed those looking to stake out their seating areas the opportunity to line up at the top of the tier stairs, as well as down by the boat docks, prior to the great "chair rush" at noon. This year the stairwells to the tiers will not be accessible during the noon "chair rush" for safety reasons, as everyene will be required to enter the Odmark Pavilion seating area from the east side of the park by the marina.

Please also note that if any chairs, blankets, coolers, etc are left in the park overnight, they will be removed and discarded by the City Department of Public Works (DPW) in the early hours of the morning. Please make sure to grab all of your belongings at the end of the evening and clean up any trash around your area so we can give our hard working City DPW a little break at the end of the night.

As a matter of safety and courtesy to others, Venetian requests your friendly cooperation, which will allow all spectators to enjoy Venetian's free admission concerts.
