

Charlie's Root Fusion will open the mainstage on Venetian Friday, laying down the jump blues, swamp boogie funk and cowboy country which have made this band a local mainstay. The group's namesake, Charlie Witthoeft, is renowned for his electrified harmonica, backed by sizzlin' "gee-tar" and robust rhythms. Charlie will thereafter pass the red hot Venetian baton to the headliners, the Purple Xperience.

Purple Xperience

Friday's evening forecast projects Purple Rain from the West as the Purple Xperience, hailing from Minnesota and featuring Marshall Charloff, thunders onto Venetian's main stage. The new wave funk rock known as the Minneapolis sound, which was pioneered by Prince, will electrify East Park. Purple Xperience will render onto Venetian the planet's most authentic tribute to Prince and The Revolution, featuring world class musicians who have jammed with the late master, Prince.



Pine River Jazz Big Band Friday, July 22 • Ferry Beach • 7 pm



Venetian's twenty year tradition of big band concerts, at Ferry Beach on Venetian Friday, remains alive and well with the Pine River Jazz Big Band. This 17 member group takes a step back in time to the Big Band Era, revisiting the likes of Count Basie and Tommy Dorsey. These local musicians have also added a few "ringers" for Venetian. One and all are welcome to ring in the Friday night air show and fireworks, with the PRJBB.

Friday Night Fireworks & Air Show Friday, July 22 • Starts around 10:20 pm

Venetian fireworks have been nationally acclaimed thanks to the talent of its renowned master pyrotechnician, Frank Loffredo, Jr., who has staged the Venetian displays for over 20 years. Venetian has never been known to rest on its laurels, however, and will again parlay Friday night fireworks with an introductory airshow, which was presented to the Festival by Mayor Luther Kurtz.



The Friday night airborne festivities will start with a high speed flyover, at approximately 10:00 p.m., with an L-39 Jet Fi-

ghter flown by Pilot/Owner Mike Terfehr from Traverse City. After a short delay to allow the twilight to finish its move toward fireworks readiness, Pilot/Owner Ken Rieder from Redline Airshows will return to Venetian with his Vans Aircraft RV-8 pyro stunt plane. Look for Redline to "scream down" the channel before entering the Lake Charlevoix airbox in proximity to Depot Beach, for another amazing pyrotechnic airshow. Frank will thereafter follow with his sensational orchestration of Venetian's "Night Sky" fireworks.

Parades of Venetian

Everyone loves a parade and the Venetian Festival has twice the fun. On Saturday, July 23, Venetian offers one parade "by land" and one "by sea".

The annual Venetian Festival Street Parade, sponsored by Berkshire Hathaway Home Services of Charlevoix, kicks off at 11 a.m., complete with everything you'd expect in a summertime parade. This year's theme is "1980's".

Parade entries typically number about 75 and include everything from marching bands, clowns, floats, antique cars, and royalty from area festivals - including the newly crowned Miss Charlevoix and her court. The parade

Returning to the Venetian Festival, the popular Traverse City-based Arnold Amusements Company will again be providing the rides, games and goodies.

The rides, midway and amusements will return to their usual position on downtown Mason Street and in the neighboring city parking lots to the north.

Rides, games, and treats will be available from 5 p.m.-11 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20; 12 p.m.-11 p.m. on Thursday, July 21; 1-11 p.m. on Friday, July 22 and 11 a.m.-11 p.m. on Saturday, July 23.

On Wednesday, all rides are \$10 for 10 (must buy sheet of 10 tickets). Thursday and Friday, tickets are \$1.25 each or 18 for \$20.

travels down Bridge Street from Carpenter to Clinton Street traffic light. After the parade, musical festivities will continue on Bridge Street and in both East and Bridge Parks.

Later that evening, as the musical performances come to an end, spectators can turn their eyes to Round Lake for the 92nd annual Boat Parade. The event attracts throngs of spectators every year as boats of all shapes and sizes, adorned with lights, music, and animation parade around Round Lake starting shortly after 10 p.m.

Boats will be judged in several categories including a People's Choice Award for the best dockside decorated boat.

There are safety and presentation standards to meet in order to participate. To register, or for more information, visit our website at www.venetianfestival.com/parade.

After the boat parade, the evening and the Festival will end brilliantly as low aerial/ high intensity fireworks rock the sky above Round Lake Harbor, in a pyrotechnic extravaganza which has been recognized nationally as one of the premier displays in North America.

The carnival and midway, which opens on On Thursday (which is Kid's Day at Hungry Ducks Farm), you can also enjoy unlimited rides with the purchase of a \$17 armband. On Friday, tickets are regularly priced, however, \$20 armbands may be purchased.

Regular tickets are otherwise \$1.25 each. All rides take three or four tickets.

Kids and grown-ups alike will find something to thrill their senses, at the always popular Venetian Festival carnival and midway.



Venetian Seating Policy

When blankets outnumber residents, things can get a little crazy down in East Park. As a result, Venetian has established a seating policy to enable those in the Pavilion area and elsewhere in East Park, to enjoy the Venetian concert experience. The seating policy has been revised somewhat this year, and will continue to address safety concerns including those posed by the "chair rush" which has occurred in the past.

This year the Pavilion seating areas will be opened for entry each morning at 8:00 a.m., including the stairwells, from Venetian Wednesday through Venetian Saturday, for those who wish to place blankets and chairs to reserve their individual seats. These arrangements will be overseen by security and law enforcement personnel. The prior "blanket zone," "tier seating," and "no standing" rules have been eliminated.

Please also note that if any chairs, blankets, coolers, etc., are left anywhere in East Park overnight, or are placed there prior to 8:00 a.m., they will be removed and discarded by the City Department of Public Works (DPW). Please make sure to grab all of your belongings at the end of the evening and clean up any trash around your area so we can give our hard working City DPW a little break at the end of the night.

As a matter of safety and courtesy to others, Venetian requests your friendly cooperation so that all spectators may enjoy Venetian's free admission concerts.
