

Many of her creations have been designed for local museums, libraries, and nonprofit organizations. Gayle is always looking for the next fun medium and is also training the next generation of beloved out of the box thinkers (a.k.a. her kids and treasured grandkids), fostering the joy of creating and of spending time in an inspiring studio.

SLEEPING GYPSIES

Into the Sky! Look Up - Friday & Saturday Nights



Venetian Airshow Friday, July 21 • 8 p.m.

Zooming back into town for the third year, Redline Airshows will again adorn the Charlevoix skies with incredible aerobatics. Hear the National Anthem echoing across the harbor as the American

Flag, flying high above with a parachutist, slowly drops down as if to join the party. Don't settle in yet though – a two-plane RV8 aerobatic act will "scream down" the channel before entering the Lake Charlevoix airbox to perform incredible airborne stunts. If that doesn't quench your "need for speed," hold on tight as Mike Terfehr rockets his MIG fighter jet high overhead. That's not all, folks, after rockin' to Snake Oil in East Park, a final RV8 show will return just before dusk – with pyrotechnics! It is the ultimate lead-in to one of Venetian's crown jewels, her vibrant "Night Sky" fireworks display. The airshow is presented to the Festival by Skydive Charlevoix.

"Night Sky" Fireworks - over Lake Charlevoix Friday, July 21 • Dusk

Venetian fireworks have been nationally acclaimed thanks to the talent of its renowned. master pyrotechnician, Frank Loffredo, Jr., who has staged the Venetian displays for over 20 vears. Venetian has continued to add bells and whistles to its colossal Night Sky Display, which is launched from the Venetian barge in Lake Charlevoix. The display will again be "introduced" by a pyro stunt plane complete with fireworks launched from the plane. Frank will thereafter follow with his sensational orchestration of Venetian's "Night Sky" fireworks.





Harbor Fireworks - over Round Lake Saturday, July 22 • Dusk

Immediately following the boat parade. Venetian's low aerial/high intensity Harbor Fireworks are staged in Charlevoix's pyrotechnic amphitheater, Round Lake Harbor. This pyrotechnic extravaganza, rivaled only by such displays as Thunder Over Louisville, will rock the sky with 10,000 pyro bursts launched from the Venetian barge, in the midst of Venetian's lighted boat parade. Unique pyrotechnic twists traditionally accompany this display, such as fireworks shells which originate beneath the surface of Round Lake and fire into the night sky.

Parades of Venetian

Everyone loves a parade and the Venetian Festival has twice the fun. On Saturday, July 22, Venetian offers one parade "by land"

and one "by sea".

The annual Venetian Festival Street Parade, sponsored by Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices of Charlevoix, kicks off at 11 a.m., complete with everything you'd expect in a summertime parade. This year's theme is "Hawaiian Luau".



Parade entries typically number about

75 and include everything from marching bands, clowns, horses, floats, antique cars, and royalty from area festivals- including the newly crowned Miss Charlevoix and her court. The parade travels down Bridge Street from Carpenter to Clinton Street traffic light. After the parade, musical festivities will continue on Bridge Street and in both East and Bridge Parks.

Later that evening, as the musical performances come to an end, spectators can turn their eyes to Round Lake for the 93rd annual Boat Parade, sponsored this year be DCL. The event attracts throngs of spectators every year as boats of all shapes and sizes, adorned with lights, music, and animation parade around Round Lake starting shortly after 10 p.m. Boats will be judged in several categories including a People's Choice Award for the best dockside decorated boat.

Venetian Carnival



The carnival and midway, which opens on Wednesday, July 19, includes popular rides such as bumper cars, Tilt-a-Whirl and the Zipper, as well as more docile rides for the younger ones. Returning is the popular Traverse City-based Arnold Amusements Company again providing the rides, games and goodies.

The amusements will return to their usual

position on Mason Street and in the neighboring city parking lots to the north. Rides, games, and treats will be available starting at 5 p.m. Wednesday, July 19. Single tickets are \$1.50 each. A strip of 15 tickets can be purchased for \$20, and a strip of 50 tickets for \$50. Rides take 3 or 4 tickets per ride. Armbands, which are good for

unlimited rides all day, can be purchased for \$25 Wednesday through close on Saturday. For a limited time on Thursday (12-5 p.m.), which is Kid's Day in East Park, armbands are discounted to \$20. Kids and grown-ups alike will find something to thrill their senses, at the always popular Venetian Festival carnival and midway.

Venetian Seating Policy

When blankets outnumber residents, things can get a little crazy down in East Park. As a result, Venetian has established a seating policy to enable those in the Pavilion area and elsewhere in East Park, to enjoy the Venetian concert experience. The seating policy has been revised somewhat, and will continue to address safety concerns including those posed by the "chair rush" which has occurred in the past.



This year the Pavilion seating areas will be opened for entry each morning at 8:00 a.m., including some stairwells, from Venetian Wednesday through Venetian Saturday, for those who wish to place blankets and chairs to reserve their individual seats. These arrangements will be overseen by security and law enforcement personnel. The prior "blanket zone," "tier seating," and "no standing" rules have been eliminated.

Please also note that if any chairs, blankets, coolers, etc., are left anywhere in East Park overnight, or are placed there prior to 8:00 a.m., they will be removed and discarded by the City Department of Public Works (DPW). Please make sure to grab all of your belongings at the end of the evening and clean up any trash around your area so we can give our hard working City DPW a little break at the end of the night.

As a matter of safety and courtesy to others, Venetian requests your friendly cooperation so that all spectators may enjoy Venetian's free admission concerts.

What's Missing at Venetian?

Have you ever noticed what is missing at the Venetian Festival?

It isn't live entertainment. During Venetian week, bands in East Park and throughout town will be jumping with a wide variety of music, including such national acts as the Little River Band. It isn't kids' activities. The Venetian Games include kids and teens in soccer, basketball, running, sailing, golf, tennis and more. Kid's Day and the Kid's Zone downtown also provide a slew of low and no cost children's entertainment. It isn't spectator opportunities. The street parade and boat parade have entertained spectators for decades. It certainly won't be fireworks that are missing, considering Venetian features two nights of world class fireworks displays, which have been recognized nationally as one of the 5 premier displays in North America.

What's missing is admission prices.

All of the major events and entertainment offered at the Venetian Festival are absolutely free to the public. But it still costs Charlevoix Venetian Festival, Inc. upwards of \$400,000 to put on its premier Festival, which is why the non-profit organization needs your help.
